
GT3 regulations have become the standard for almost all of the national and international GT series across the world, with the Australian GT Championship becoming the latest national championship to adopt GT3 rules in 2012. The FIA GT1 World Championship will also adopt GT3 technical regulations from 2012 onwards.

GT3 CHAMPIONS

- Sean Edwards (2006) Double race winner in Formula One supporting Porsche Supercup with Konrad Motorsport, who went on to become 2008 Porsche Supercup Team Champions.
- James Ruffier (2008) became the first GT3 Champion to win an FIA GT race overall.
- Christian Hohenadel (2010) became the first GT3 Champion to win a GT1 World Championship race and finished 3rd overall in the 2011 World Championship.

Since its start the FIA GT3 European Championship attracts some of the leading amateur and semi professional GT drivers. It is a platform where the grid is a mixture between established international GT drivers, real gentleman drivers and young racers who are coming from single seaters and taking their first steps in sportscar racing. The FIA GT3 European Championship was and is the perfect training ground for drivers of all abilities who want to compete on the international stage in GT racing.

The Future...

Not content to rest on several notable achievements of the past years, SRO is constantly striving to improve the appeal of the FIA GT3 European Championship in the coming years and bring it to new success.

Therefore SRO and the FIA will make some changes and amendments to the sporting regulation of the FIA GT3 European Championship:

- As before, up to six cars per brand permitted in full-season entries, with two cars allowed in the first year of homologation. Every team must enter two cars.
- Race-by-race entries are allowed with no brand or car number restrictions, but they will not score points towards Teams title.
- A minimum of 7 races per season, with 6 races on the provisional calendar. The teams and drivers will score points towards the Team and Drivers titles of the FIA GT3 European Championship.
- Two free practice sessions, maximum of 80 minutes on Friday.
- One qualifying session divided into two sessions, Q1 and Q2, on Saturday. All drivers must qualify. The fastest time set in qualifying 1 will set the grid for the Race 1 on Saturday. The fastest time set in qualifying 2 will set the grid for Race 2 on Sunday. Driver 1 will start Race 1; Driver 2 will start Race 2. Driver 1 will be the driver with the lower categorisation, for pairings of different categories, or as chosen by the team for drivers with the same category.

- Each race will be 60 minutes long, with an obligatory pit stop for driver change and all four tyres between the 25th and 35th minutes. A rolling start will be used.
- Points will be awarded to the races in accordance with the scale 25-18-15-12-10-8-6-4-2-1.
- Driver Categorisation will be applied. Platinum drivers may not compete. Gold drivers may only be paired with Bronze drivers.
- Compensation times will be added to the pit stop time for the first, second and third place from each race. Compensation time will not be accumulated for the next event. 15 seconds for 1st place, 10 seconds for 2nd place and 5 seconds for 3rd place.
- Fees for the 2012 FIA GT3 European Championship will be € 4,500 per car per event or € 27,000 for a full season of six rounds.
